Car Park Work

By the time you read this, most of the remaining works will have been completed by the contractors. The car park should be in use by the end of March. There are still some finishing off jobs to be completed before final sign off. The existing carpark will also remain in use.

Play Park

The play park is open. The equipment that is being relocated is scheduled for reinstallation in April along with a new line of fencing above the short drop to the tennis courts. We are working with a local contractor on some possible options for the toddler play area for the village to consider.

Allotments

The three remaining allotment holders at the ground have been offered the three plots in the area west of the new car park and they have each taken a plot.

General Ground Report

The artificial wicket, which was beyond reasonable repair, has been removed. The diseased sycamore on the entrance driveway will be felled on 25th March.

The bare soil areas between the car park and buildings will be grass seeded. We are looking at planting scheme options for the two small beds at the entrance to the car parks.

Village Hall

The replacement hardwood, double-glazed windows have been installed. Once the weather is suitable, the exteriors of these will be painted green and we will also repaint the south, east and north walls of the hall and both sets of entrance doors and the snooker room.

Origami for VJ Day

Everton WI. would like to commemorate 80 years since Victory over Japan Day (VJ Day) 15th August 1945. Although fighting had ceased in Europe on VE day on 8th May 1945, allied troops including those from UK, USA and USSR were still fighting in Japan. The US dropped two atomic bombs on the Japanese cities of Hiroshima and Nagasaki which finally stopped the conflict.

Everton WI. would like to commemorate 80 years since VJ day by creating origami cranes which we hope to display in the village.



The crane is a Japanese symbol of peace and hope. Japanese legend has it that cranes live for 1000 years and that if a sick person folds 1000 paper cranes, their wishes will come true.

A young girl called Sadako Sasaki was two years old when the bomb was dropped on Hiroshima. She survived the bombing but later developed leukemia. She began folding cranes whilst in hospital and managed to fold 644 cranes before she died, aged twelve. Her friends completed the 1000 cranes and buried them all with her. Her wish was to get well and that there would be peace in the world.

There is a statue of Sadako in the Peace Memorial Park in Hiroshima holding a golden crane in her hands.

Her plaque reads, 'This is our cry. This is our prayer. Peace in the world'.

We doubt we will manage to make 1000 cranes, but we would like to make as many as we can before 15th August. We need your help please. We have some origami paper and will be at the Craft Demonstration Day in church on the 22nd of June, where you can come and have a go. We will also be folding cranes at the Tuesday knitting group.

If you would like to have a go, there are lots of videos on you tube, and printed instructions on the internet. We are using 8 1/4 inch (21cm) squares of origami paper in bright colours or patterns. Please contact Diane Howe on 07903825082 if you would like more information.


Circus of Wonders







WATER BILLS

By now most households will have received their Anglian Water bills. Shock, horror, they have risen by 32.5%, or £130. We have yet to receive the Severn Trent bill for surface water and sewerage which will have risen by 20%?

Bills now seem to be loaded with standing charges. These were introduced to electricity bills in the form of a daily charge. Water bills now have an annual fixed charge. Anglian's Fixed Charge accounts for 88% of the bill; actual water charges the other 12%. It makes the adoption of water meters financially unnecessary.

I have researched the web sites of Anglian, Ofwat, Discover Water and Money Supermarket to analyse the details of price rises as they vary across the Country. The average figure for our area is about £630. We will be close, or slightly above this figure when the Severn Trent bill is added.

These rises have been approved by Ofwat and they justify their reasons in a very thinly worded 2 paragraph press statement. Delving deeper into the Ofwat site produces a mire of word spaghetti but basically the funds are to cover infrastructure spending in the period 2025 – 2030.

The Anglian Water web site offers a variety of reasons for the price hike, many of them buried in the darker recesses of their site. Among the factors Anglian considered are;

There will be 700,000 more people settling in Anglian's area in the next 20 years,

The wish to be at the front line of climate change,

Combat climate change,

Representation at COP 26,


Actively committed to better water quality in Nepal,

A driving force in the organisation, Utilities Against Modern Slavery.

Finally this is not the end of the price rises. They will increase annually up to a total of £100.
