
James' blend of jazz, pop and the golden era of swing provides a unique performance and one that his audiences will never forget.



# Going Zero

by Anthony McCarten


Anthony McCarten's *Going Zero* is a thought-provoking and brilliantly crafted thriller that blends fast-paced suspense with timely questions about technology, surveillance, and personal freedom.

Set in the near future, the novel centres on a ground breaking tech initiative: a high-stakes government-funded experiment run by a powerful tech company called Fusion. Ten participants are chosen to "go zero"—that is, disappear completely for 30 days. If they succeed in evading detection by the company's cutting-edge tracking system, they win a life-changing cash prize. If they're found, they lose.

The story zeroes in on one of the participants, a seemingly unremarkable librarian named Kaitlyn Day. But as the clock ticks, it becomes clear that Kaitlyn is far more resourceful—and has far more at stake—than anyone anticipated. As she moves through the shadows of a hyper-connected society, dodging drones, facial recognition software, and digital breadcrumbs, her journey becomes more than just a game of hide and seek. With every step, the tension escalates and new layers of intrigue are revealed.

McCarten excels at balancing action with character, gradually peeling back the motivations of both Kaitlyn and the team tasked with tracking her. The result is a smart, tightly-woven thriller with a central mystery that keeps the reader guessing.

While the novel raises big ideas about privacy, surveillance, and digital autonomy, it does so in service of a compelling story



rather than a lecture. The focus stays on the chase, the strategy, and the human element behind the tech.

With a propulsive plot, clever twists, and a heroine you can root for, *Going Zero* delivers a satisfying blend of tension and thematic depth. It's a gripping page-turner that also feels startlingly relevant in a world where disappearing is harder than ever.



# Dear Friends,

It's not always easy to be thankful. We live in a world that feels increasingly divided and uncertain. News headlines often draw our attention to conflicts, hardship, and discord. Closer to home, many of us carry private worries about health, finances, family, or the future. Gratitude can almost feel like a luxury when life is heavy.

And that choice can transform us, because thankfulness is not the end of the story. It stirs something within us, a desire to share. Gratitude leads to generosity. When we realise how much we have received, our hearts are opened to give and in a divided world, generosity may be one of the strongest witnesses we can offer.

Generosity takes many forms:

- We can be generous with our time. When divisions deepen, listening patiently, showing kindness, and making space for others can bridge gaps. A few moments of genuine presence with someone who feels overlooked can be life-giving.
- We can be generous with our talents. Each of us has gifts — creativity, skills, passions — that can bring joy, healing, or hope to others. Sharing these gifts reminds us that everyone has something valuable to contribute, no matter how small it seems.

• We can be generous with our resources. In an age of financial strain and global need, supporting causes that care for the vulnerable, giving regularly to the church, or simply offering what we can is a way of shining light into uncertainty.

Living generously is not always easy, especially when fear and scarcity dominate the atmosphere of our times. But generosity breaks the cycle of division. It tells a different story, one rooted in trust, kindness, and hope.

So perhaps this season, we might each take a moment to ask: What am I thankful for, even here, even now? And then: How can I let that thankfulness spill over into generosity?

Gratitude will not erase the world's troubles, but it can change how we face them. And generosity, which flows from gratitude, can build bridges, mend wounds, and remind us — and others — that God's love is still at work, even in uncertain days.





# TONY'S TOPICS

## Energy

The UK energy price cap for a typical (whatever that is) household from 1 Oct to 31 Dec is to be £1,755 per year. Your energy supplier, as there is no mains gas in our 4 villages, it is only the electricity supplier. They will automatically increase your standard variable tariff.

Low users of electricity will be most adversely affected. Even if you burned candles for light, sat clothed in 4 jumpers with no electric heating on, you would still pay the daily standing charge of 53.68p per day. This is equal to £16.64 for a 31-day month or about £195 a year.

In August, OFGEM stated that the cost of switching off wind farms has been instrumental in pushing up electricity energy bills by as much as £15 per year for each household. Another statistic in the public domain stated that the cost of subsidies for electricity generation runs at a staggering £15 billion a year.

You may think that it was impossible to squander so much money on subsidies. However, that is what happens in the underhanded UK energy supply system. Here is just one example of this largesse.

Ecotricity is a tiny company owned by Dale Vince. It supplies 0.05% of the country's electricity generation requirement. However, in recent years, Vince and his company have received £145 million in energy subsidies. Many of the projects will involve the construction of solar farms on prime agricultural land.

Closer to home, let's look at the Steeple Renewable Project. Please study the map for the proposals. This nightmare plan involves

surrounding the village of Sturton-Le-Steeple with a sea of imported solar panels. This scheme is unconscionable and surely financially ruinous for the residents of Sturton-Le-Steeple. House values will plummet.

What is the alternative, some may say? Well, the Gainsborough Basin holds around 16 trillion cubic feet of recoverable gas, enough to meet the UK demand for several years. There is even a gas-fired plant at West Burton Power Station next door. A precise, readily available solution.

Is there a desire for sense and sensibility in this country? (with apologies to Jane Austin) Will common sense prevail? Who is telling the Government to follow these ruinous policies?



Pictured is a small snapshot of the recent volcanic eruptions near Grindavik (now abandoned) in Iceland. On a daily basis, it was emitting sulphur dioxide and other noxious gases at 3 times the rate of all European industry combined. The recent Northerly winds then transferred these gases to the UK. We are very small players in the global scheme of things.
